

Clinicians and basic scientists are invited to submit papers in the poster format that relate to the fields of TMD and Orofacial Pain. Submissions should fall within one of the following categories:

- ▶ Prevalence, progression, and societal impact
- Diagnostic, clinical, and experimental characteristics
- Pathophysiology and pain mechanisms
- ▶ Efficacy and techniques of management

Criteria for Selection

- Abstracts must be original scientific material that has not been previously published or presented at any other national or international meeting.
- The scientific committee will give high preference to original clinical or basic research abstracts of Randomized Controlled Trials and Observational Studies (Cohort study, Case control study).
- Case reports may be accepted only if the scientific committee determines that the material presented is of high interest and high quality information.

The body of the abstracts must not exceed 250 words and must contain the following eight sections IN THIS ORDER and labeled as noted:

 Title: (Title text should be in bolded font. Capitalize the first word and all proper nouns contained in the title and sub-title. Do NOT use all capitals. Clearly indicate the nature of the study in the title (i.e.: case-control, randomized controlled trial, etc.).

- Author(s): (Authors should be listed by last name, followed by first name initials, after the abstract title. The name of the presenting author should be underlined).
- Affiliations: (Indicate any affiliations to a University/College or Private Practitioners and city).
- Aim of Investigation: (aims/purpose, hypotheses, and goals of the investigation).
- Methods: (brief description of experimental procedures including statistics, study design and analysis).
- \bullet Results: (findings of statistical analysis).
- Conclusions: (one or two major conclusions that are supported by results)
- Acknowledgements and/or Funding Source: (include reference to grant support, (including grant number), and disclosure of any financial relationship the author may have with the manufacturer/supplier of any commercial products or services)

Submission Requirements:

All abstracts MUST be accompanied by the Abstract Submission Form.





Active Members shall possess the right to vote in the election of officers, at the annual membership business meeting and for all items required to be presented to the membership of the academy for further action. Regular payment of dues is a requirement for maintenance of Active membership in the Academy.

Physician Affiliate Members

Shall be a licensed physician (M.D. or D.O. or equivalent degree) in good standing within the state or country within which they practice and have an interest in the treatment of temporomandibular disorders, orofacial pain and sleep disorders. Physician Affiliate Members may serve on or chair a committee and/or serve on Council. Physician Affiliate Members shall possess all membership privileges and assume all duties and responsibilities of Active Membership except the right to vote or be an Academy Officer. Regular payment of dues is a requirement for maintenance of Physician Affiliate membership in the Academy.

Affiliate Members

Shall be a non-dental or non-physician allied health professional or researcher in good standing within the state of country of their practice and have an interest in the treatment of temporomandibular disorders, orofacial pain and sleep disorders. Affiliate Members may serve on or chair a committee and/or serve on Council. Affiliate Members shall possess all membership privileges and assume all duties and responsibilities of Active Membership except the right to vote or be an Academy Officer. Regular payment of dues is a requirement for maintenance of Affiliate membership in the Academy.

Student/Initiatory Members

Shall be a current full-time dental or post-graduate dental student in good academic standing, and one of the following: (1) a licensed dentist (D.D.S., D.M.D. or equivalent degree) in good standing within the state or country within which they practice and a current participant of an Academy recognized post-doctoral full-time university residency program, or (2) a licensed dentist (D.D.S., D.M.D. or equivalent degree) in good standing within the state or country within which they practice and a graduate within the past 12 months of an Academy recognized post-doctoral full-time university residency program or (3) a full time, current undergraduate dental student with interest in temporomandibular disorders and/or orofacial pain or

(4) be a licensed dentist (D.D.S., D.M.D. or equivalent degree) in good standing within the state or country within which they practice and enrolled in, or successfully completed within the past 12 months, an orofacial pain post-graduate or residency program not described above and approved by council for student/initiatory membership. A full-time orofacial pain post-graduate or residency program must be consistent with current CODA accreditation standards Student/Initiatory Members may serve on or chair a committee. Student/Initiatory Members shall possess the right to vote in the election of officers, at the annual membership business meeting and for all items required to presented to the membership of the academy for further action. Student/Initiatory Members shall have all the add'l benefits of membership except a subscription to the AAOP designated journal. Regular payment of dues is a requirement for maintenance of Student/Initatory membership in the Academy.

Additional Membership Categories

Fellow, Retired, Life and Honorary Membership are elevated categories of membership available to members upon completion of additional criteria as stated in the AAOP Bylaws.

Additional Membership Criteria

In addition to the stated criteria listed in Membership Categories, Members Shall:

- 1. Agree to adhere to the Academy's Code of Conduct.
- Be willing to work within the Academy's Objectives to promote the best interest and ideals of the Academy.
- 3. Be approved by Council upon recommendation of the Membership Committee.
